Mechanics and Guidelines of the Contest

- In celebration of the rich history and significant milestones of North Eastern Mindanao State University's campuses, we proudly present "PAGTANAW AT PAG-ALPAS: A Video Documentary Contest." This event invites all campuses to showcase their creativity and storytelling skills by producing compelling video documentaries that capture the essence of their campus journeys.
- 2. Participants are encouraged to delve into their campus' unique historical narratives, significant achievements, and the transformative moments that have shaped their academic environment. This contest celebrates the past and looks forward to the future, embodying the theme of "Pag-alpas," symbolizing liberation and growth.
- 3. ALPAS also means Academic Leverage towards Progressive and Aboveboard Service: The Flight of NEMSU to Excellence, which is the current administration's brand of governance and leadership.
- 4. Each entry will be judged on content accuracy, creativity, technical quality, emotional impact, and adherence to the theme. Special awards for Best Cinematography, Best Voice-Over Artist, and Best Original Score or Sound Design will also be presented, recognizing excellence in specific aspects of documentary production.
- Join us in this exciting endeavor as we honor our history, celebrate our milestones, and envision the boundless future of North Eastern Mindanao State University.
- 6. There shall be one (1) entry only per campus
- 7. The campus production team should consist of all employees, whether regular, coterminous, temporary, Contract of Service, or Job Order.
- 8. Each campus should complete the entry form (see attached) and send it to on or before July 19, 2024.
- 9. The duration of the video documentary should only be at least 5 and a maximum of 10 minutes. A deduction of 1 point per lacking or exceeding minute shall be deducted from the total or average score of the judges.
- 10. The video documentary has 2 major parts- PAGTANAW AT PAG-ALPAS. Pagtanaw highlights the history of the campus while Pag-ALPAS highlights the milestones achieved by the campus and how they thrived in such journey. The milestones may refer to various areas either in academics, administration, or research, extension, and even production. It may also refer to the best practices of the campus that is unique from other campuses. It shall also highlight the

impact of the campus initiatives to the lives of the students, faculty, staff, stakeholders and the communities it serves.

- 11. The criteria for judging the winners and the special awards are attached to these mechanics and guidelines.
- 12. Winners will get the following cash prizes:
 - a. Champion- 18,000.00
 - b. 1st Runner Up- 13,000.00

 - c. 2nd Runner Up- 8,000.00
 d. Consolation- 4,000.00 each
 - e. Best Cinematography- 1,000.00
 - f. Best Voice-over Artist- 1,000.00
 - g. Best Original Score or Sound Design- 1,000.00
- 13. The film-viewing and judging will be done on July 30, 2024; 3:00 PM at the University Gymnasium of Tandag Campus. All teams from the campuses should be at the venue at 2:00 PM.
- 14. Winners will be awarded during the NEMSU: BURAK! PAKAK! The Cultural Night of this year's University Day.
- 15. Entries must be submitted via email to information@nemsu.edu.ph on or before July 29, 2024, until 5:00 PM only.
- 16. Attached are the video specifications for guidance and reference of the participating teams.
- 17. As the video documentary duration is only 5-10 minutes, priority shall be given to the recent milestones of the campus.
- 18. Violation of any of the above mechanics and guidelines of the contest shall be deemed disqualified unless otherwise explicitly expressed in each item (that only a point deduction will be imposed).

Criteria for Judging

PAGTANAW AT PAG-ALPAS A Video Documentary Contest on the Campuses' History and Milestones

These criteria will help ensure the judging process is fair and comprehensive, considering various aspects of documentary filmmaking that contribute to a wellrounded and engaging final product.

1. Content and Accuracy (30%)

- Historical accuracy and depth of research.
- Coverage of significant milestones and achievements.
- Relevance and clarity of information presented.

- 2. Creativity and Originality (20%) Innovative approach to storytelling.
 - Unique presentation style and original content.
 - Creative use of visuals, music, and narration.

3. Technical Quality (20%)

- Quality of video and audio production (e.g., clarity, lighting, sound).
- Professionalism in editing, transitions, and pacing.
- Use of graphics, animations, and special effects.

4. Emotional Impact and Engagement (15%)

- Ability to engage and captivate the audience.
- Emotional resonance and storytelling impact.
- Use of interviews, personal stories, and compelling narratives.

5. Adherence to Theme (10%)

- Alignment with the contest theme of "Pagtanaw at Pag-ALPAS."
- Effective representation of the campuses' history and milestones.
- Consistency in theme throughout the documentary.

6. Overall Presentation (5%)

- Coherence and logical flow of the documentary.
- Professionalism and polish in the final product.
- Overall impression and impact.

Criteria for Judging Special Awards:

These criteria ensure that each special award focuses on the key elements that make these aspects of the documentary stand out, recognizing excellence in specific production areas.

1. BEST CINEMATOGRAPHY

Composition and Framing (30%)

- Creative and effective use of framing and composition.
- Visual storytelling through shot selection and angles.

Lighting and Color (25%)

- Appropriate and creative use of lighting.
- Color grading and consistency in visual tone.

Camera Movement and Techniques (25%)

- Smooth and purposeful camera movements (e.g., pans, tilts, zooms).
 Use of advanced techniques like tracking shots, aerial shots, etc.

Visual Impact and Clarity (20%)

- Overall visual clarity and sharpness.
- Impact of visuals in conveying the documentary's message.

2. BEST VOICE-OVER ARTIST

Clarity and Articulation (30%)

- Clear pronunciation and articulation.
- Consistent volume and tone.

Expressiveness and Emotion (30%)

- Appropriate emotional delivery matching the content.
- Ability to engage and captivate the audience through voice.

Pacing and Timing (20%)

- Effective pacing and timing of narration.
- Smooth transitions and flow with the visuals.

Suitability and Authenticity (20%)

- Voice suitability for the documentary's theme and content.
- Authenticity and believability in the narration.

3. BEST ORIGINAL SCORE OR SOUND DESIGN

Originality and Creativity (30%)

- Original composition and innovative sound design.
- Creativity in blending different audio elements.

- Emotional Impact (25%)

 Ability of the music/sound design to enhance the emotional tone.

 Contribution to the overall atmosphere and mood.

- Integration with Visuals (25%)
 Seamless synchronization with the visuals.
 Effective use of sound to complement and enhance the story.

- Technical Quality (20%)
 Clarity and quality of the audio production.
 Professionalism in mixing and mastering the audio.

- Preferred: 4K (3840x2160 pixels) for higher quality

2. Aspect Ratio

- Standard: 16:9

DRESS CODE FOR THE 3RD UNIVERSITY DAY CELEBRATION July 30, 2024 3:00 PM onwards at the University Gymnasium of Tandag Campus

Those taking their oath as newly appointed or promoted employees will be in Barong Tagalog and Filipiniana.

For all other attendees:

The Mamanwa and Manobo are indigenous groups in the Philippines, particularly in Surigao del Sur. Each has a unique culture and traditional accessories. Both groups use their accessories to express their identity, cultural heritage, and social status. Each piece carries specific symbolic meanings and is often handmade with traditional techniques passed down through generations.

Option A: All other attendees will be wearing shirts and trousers with tribal accessories such as the following:

Mamanwa

1. Beaded Necklaces and Bracelets

The Mamanwa people are known for their intricate beadwork. They create colorful necklaces and bracelets using various beads, shells, and seeds.

2. Headdresses

They often wear headbands or headdresses adorned with beads and sometimes feathers.

3. Earrings and Pendants

Made from natural materials such as seeds, bones, and shells.

Manobo

1. Tangkulo

A colorful headscarf or turban worn by men, often with elaborate embroidery or beadwork.

2. Beaded Jeweiry

Like the Mamanwa, the Manobo are skilled in beadwork, creating intricate necklaces, bracelets, and anklets.

3. Tassels and Fringes

Clothing and accessories often feature decorative tassels and fringes.

4. Bells and Shells

Accessories may include small bells and shells attached to clothing and jewelry to create a distinctive sound when moving.

5. Arm Bands and Leg Bands

Made from various materials, including metal, plant fibers, and beads.


Option B: Women wear Manobo woven skirts and blouses (traditional garments) with detailed embroidery, while men wear traditional woven shirts and trousers.

Option C: Smart Casual with tribal accessories enumerated above.


Option D: Modern Barong/Filipiniana.
