GUIDELINES FOR ACADEMIC FREEZE FOR BOTH FACULTY

AND STUDENTS

Greetings of peace and solidarity.

In response to the national mandate on mental health and the need to prioritize the well-being of our students and faculty, the University will implement an academic freeze following the conduct of midterm examinations. This initiative aims to provide students with a much-needed respite and allow faculty members to recharge and prepare for the succeeding academic activities.

The academic freeze is essential to prioritize the mental health and well-being of students and faculty members. By providing a brief respite from academic demands, we can help to reduce stress, improve academic performance, and foster a healthier learning environment. This initiative aligns with the national government's commitment to promoting mental health and well-being.

National Laws Supporting the Purpose:

 Republic Act No. 11036 - Mental Health Act of 2018: Mandates the promotion of mental health and prevention of mental illness.

 Republic Act No. 7392 - Philippine Sports Commission Act: Recognizes the importance of physical and mental health.

 Civil Service Commission Memorandum Circular No. 20-2020: Encourages government agencies to prioritize employee mental health.

Key Points from the Law:

- Emphasizes the importance of promoting mental health and preventing mental illness.
- Advocates for a comprehensive approach to development, including emotional and social well-being.
- Addresses the mental health of government employees, applicable to academic institutions.

Guidelines:

- Academic Freeze Period: The academic freeze will commence on October 21 and end on October 22, 2024. All classes, including synchronous and asynchronous sessions, will be suspended during this period.

- Student Respite: Students are encouraged to utilize this time for rest, relaxation, and self-care. The University will provide resources and support for students seeking mental health services.
- 3. Faculty Work-from-Home Arrangement: Faculty members will be required to work from home during the academic freeze period. They will be expected to log in to the University's Google Workspace platform to access necessary resources and continue their administrative/academic duties. Faculty members are also instructed to prepare an accomplishment report for these two days' work-from home modality which will include but not limited to rating students' output during the midterm exam and other academic related tasks. The Human Resources Unit will ensure that all faculty members will be able to log in via online.
- 4. Administrative Operations: Essential administrative functions will continue during the academic freeze period, but non-urgent tasks may be postponed or delegated. The University will ensure that all necessary services and support are available to students and faculty members.
- For those faculty who will join the Council's meeting, the schedule will proceed as announced.

The proposed academic freeze is a strategic investment in the long-term success of the University. By prioritizing the mental health and well-being of our students and faculty, we are fostering a culture of compassion, resilience, and academic excellence. This initiative demonstrates the University's commitment to providing a supportive and nurturing environment that empowers individuals to reach their full potential.

The academic freeze also presents an opportunity for cost-saving measures. By suspending regular academic operations for two days, the University can reduce energy consumption, maintenance costs, and other operational expenses.

Given the approval of the academic calendar by the Board, which outlines the academic freeze, these guidelines should be adhered for proper implementation. 
